12 *vided*, That of this amount, \$4,500,000 shall be made  
13 available to combat malaria and \$55,000,000 shall be  
14 made available for maternal and child health programs,  
15 of which \$35,000,000 shall be made available for a United  
16 States contribution to GAVI, the Vaccine Alliance.

17 DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE

18 For an additional amount for “Development Assist-  
19 ance”, \$361,840,000, to remain available until September  
20 30, 2017, of which \$193,782,000 shall be made available  
21 to support the Plan of the Alliance for Prosperity in the  
22 Northern Triangle of Central America.

3 Assistance”, \$573,800,000, to remain available until ex-  
4 pended.

8 tember 30, 2017, of which \$70,050,000 shall be made  
9 available to support the Plan of the Alliance for Prosperity  
10 in the Northern Triangle of Central America, and of which  
11 \$350,000,000 shall be made available for the Green Cli-  
12 mate Fund.

19 remain available until expended, of which \$111,000,000  
20 shall be used for payment to the International Develop-  
21 ment Association by the Secretary of the Treasury to sat-  
22 isfy commitments made by the United States to support  
23 the Multilateral Debt Relief Initiative, including through  
24 generation of early encashment credits.

2                   RECONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT

3       For an additional amount for “Contribution to the  
4 International Bank for Reconstruction and Development”,  
5 \$96,460,000, to remain available until expended.

6       CONTRIBUTION TO THE CLEAN TECHNOLOGY FUND

7       For an additional amount for “Contribution to the  
8 Clean Technology Fund”, \$85,340,000, to remain avail-  
9 able until expended.

10       CONTRIBUTION TO THE STRATEGIC CLIMATE FUND

11       For an additional amount for “Contribution to the  
12 Strategic Climate Fund”, \$29,810,000, to remain avail-  
13 able until expended.

14                   GREEN CLIMATE FUND

15       For payment to the International Bank for Recon-  
16 struction and Development as trustee for the Green Cli-  
17 mate Fund by the Secretary of the Treasury,  
18 \$150,000,000, to remain available until expended.

8 Asian Development Fund”, \$83,043,000, to remain avail-  
9 able until expended.

10 CONTRIBUTION TO THE AFRICAN DEVELOPMENT BANK

11 For an additional amount for “Contribution to the  
12 African Development Bank”, \$17,059,000, to remain  
13 available until expended.

14 CONTRIBUTION TO THE AFRICAN DEVELOPMENT FUND

15 For an additional amount for “Contribution to the  
16 African Development Fund”, \$127,250,000, to remain  
17 available until expended, of which \$13,500,000 shall be  
18 used for payment to the African Development Fund by  
19 the Secretary of the Treasury to satisfy commitments  
20 made by the United States to support the Multilateral  
21 Debt Relief Initiative, including through generation of  
22 early encashment credits.

3 For an additional amount for “Contribution to the  
4 North American Development Bank”, \$22,500,000, to re-  
5 main available until expended.

6 CONTRIBUTION TO THE INTERNATIONAL FUND FOR  
7 AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT

8 For an additional amount for “Contribution to the  
9 International Fund for Agricultural Development”,  
10 \$15,965,000, to remain available until expended.

11 GENERAL PROVISIONS

12 SEC. 9001. None of the amounts appropriated or oth-  
13 erwise made available by this title may be obligated or ex-  
14 pended, and no authority granted under this title may be  
15 exercised, until the date of the enactment into law of an  
16 Act entitled the “Bipartisan Budget Act of 2015” or any  
17 other Act increasing the post-sequester discretionary caps  
18 set forth in the Budget Control Act of 2011 (Public Law  
19 112–25).

20 SEC. 9002. The Export-Import Bank Act of 1945 (12  
21 U.S.C. 635 et seq.) shall be applied through September  
22 30, 2016, by substituting such date for “September 30,  
23 2014” in section 7 of such Act (12 U.S.C. 635f).
