

## **The Leahy Disaster Supplemental Compromise**

The Leahy Compromise adds needed, new resources for 11 states and territories to the Republican Substitute to address the historic damage of hurricanes Maria, Irma and Harvey, and other disasters. If adopted, the Senate and the House could move quickly to final passage, and avoid the need for a time-consuming conference. These resources **added** to the Republican Substitute include:

### **\$431 Million In Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Funds For Territories And States To Cover The FEMA Cost-Share On Relief Projects:**
