The Leahy-Schumer Amendment

The Leahy-Schumer Amendment provides \$16.7 billion in disaster assistance including \$2.5 billion in new funding for communities in the Southeast and Midwest and restoring certain funding for Puerto Rico and other states and territories. In total, the amendment would add \$3.2 billion to Senate Republican bill, of which only \$462 million is for Puerto Rico. These resources <u>added</u> to the Republican Substitute include:
