The purpose of this letter is to request a change for a Fiscal Year 2024 Congressionally Directed Spending project in the Senate Commerce, Justice, Science, and Related Agencies appropriations bill, listed below. I certify that neither I nor my immediate family has a pecuniary interest in any of the Congressionally Directed Spending items that I have requested, consistent with the requirements of paragraph 9 of Rule XLIV of the Standing Rules of the Senate.

This correction is necessary because Alvirne High School, the original partner of the Aviation Museum of New Hampshire in this plane-build program, has rescinded its agreement to participate in this proposed program. The Aviation Museum, seeking to find a new partner, issued a Request for Proposals from other schools. Lebanon High School was the leading school and is eager to embrace this educational program to the benefit of participating students.
